

### Organizing to #FreeThemNowCT



This evening, we held our **#FreeThemNowCT Call to Action** to protect incarcerated people from COVID-19. As we enter the third year of the pandemic, Connecticut remains without a legitimate, comprehensive, or transparent plan to manage COVID-19 in the Department of Corrections. To date, more than 90% of people detained in jails and prisons in the state have tested positive for COVID-19. We're introducing a bill this session to develop a comprehensive and transparent pandemic response plan for COVID-19, and any future public health crises.

During the meeting, we provided an overview of our **#FreeThemNowCT Campaign**, shared a template for submitting public testimony, and provided other ways to take collective action. #### **Health Care in the DOC**



On Monday, our member Liv testified before the Public Health Committee in support of <u>SB 448</u>: An Act Concerning the Delivery of Health Care and Mental Health Care Services to Incarcerated People in Correctional Institutions.

Liv talked about how health care is an absolute human right and the state must provide quality health care – that includes dental and mental health care services – to all incarcerated people in Connecticut. As we are still in the midst of the COVID-19, it is unacceptable to delay health care any longer. Lawmakers must pass SB 448 with our recommended amendments this legislative session. **Read Liv's full testimony here**.
