Grassroots Movements Are Needed to End Mass Incarceration

The 2020 presidential race is spurring more debate about the role and influence of billionaires in our country and political system. As the criminal justice reform movement grows, an increasing number of billionaires are getting involved as donors, including here in New York, home to many in the billionaire class.

This week, dozens of state legislators are gathering at the ritzy Ritz Carlton in Westchester for a conference on criminal justice reform in New York. More than 50 state legislators are scheduled to attend, including Speaker Carl Heastie and Senate Majority Leader Andrea Stewart Cousins. The agenda includes visiting a state prison to meet with people detained there, discussing recent policy changes championed by grassroots groups, and creating an agenda for criminal justice reform in New York State.

In an opinion editorial by Katal's co-executive directors, **Lorenzo Jones** and **gabriel sayegh**, we address why this is an issue and why its imperative that grassroots movements lead efforts to transform our country's -- New York's specifically -- deeply broken and racist criminal justice system, in order to ultimately end mass incarceration.
