Take Action With Us Now

This week, Katal members and supporters have been taking action online, demanding elected officials in Connecticut and New York -- including Governor Ned Lamont and Governor Andrew Cuomo -- take meaningful and urgent action to release as many incarcerated people as possible to save lives amid the COVID-19 public health crisis.

• *In Connecticut*, incarcerated men who test positive for COVID-19 are transferred to Northern CI, a facility deemed *torture* by the United Nations Special Rapporteur. Coronavirus is a death sentence for our incarcerated community members, brothers, sisters, fathers, mothers, friends. *If you live in CT, TAKE ACTION NOW* to demand Gov. Lamont address the health and safety of incarcerated people in the state. <u>Use this link</u> to email Governor Ned Lamont to demand the urgent release of as many people as possible to stop the spread and impact of #COVID19, and save lives.

- Across New York State, 75% of people in custody who have died since the COVID-19 pandemic began were either Black or Latinx. This is outrageous. NYS must decarcerate jails and prisons statewide to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and save lives. New Yorkers, TAKE ACTION NOW! <u>Use this link</u> to email Gov.
