This event will feature a roundtable discussion about effective public health responses to drug-related problems in the U.S. and abroad, with criminal justice and public health experts from North and South America -- Seattle, Canada, Mexico, and Colombia.

The Katal Center for Health, Equity, and Justice is working with the Open Society Foundations to bring an international delegation to the U.S. to meet with local groups and community members and discuss the movement to end the War on Drugs at the local, national, and international level.

The tour is visiting five cities: Atlanta, Denver, Seattle, Chicago, and New York City. At each site, local organizers and international delegates will connect local reform efforts to the upcoming United Nations General Assembly Special Session (UNGASS) in New York City on April 19-21, where nations will discuss global drug policies.

Seattle was chosen as a location for the UNGASS International Delegation Tour because of its groundbreaking work in developing alternative and effective drug policies.
